

Fairley House School Job Description for Class Teacher/Form Tutor

- 1. Working as a member of a trans-disciplinary team
- 2. Contributing to providing a first class education for students with specific learning difficulties through a whole school approach
- 3. Contributing to maintaining FHS as a safe and healthy environment.
- 4. Taking responsibility for a class/form of children with specific learning difficulties, taking an interest in each child, maintaining high standards of pastoral care and close links with parents.
- 5. Writing and reviewing IEPs in co-operation with parents, pupils and the special provision department.
- 6. Contributing to implementing the IEPs so that each child has the chance to develop his or her potential to the full.
- 7. Teaching Maths and literacy and additional subjects as agreed, using eclectic, varied and motivating, multi-sensory approaches.
- 8. Following School policy on planning and assessment.
- 9. Maintaining up-to-date knowledge of the National Curriculum.
- 10. Keeping careful and detailed records of pupils' attainments and reporting these accurately to parents, colleagues, receiving schools and LEAs.
- 11. Maintaining contact with all other members of staff who teach particular children in the form/class so that a coherent approach to the teaching of children with specific learning difficulties is maintained throughout the school.
- 12. Ensuring that the individual children in the class are encouraged during the unstructured periods of the school day, such as break and meal-times, to develop self-discipline and to foster responsible and considerate behaviour.
- 13. Performing those rota duties required of all members of staff, such as lunch and break supervision.
- 14. Attending INSET Days at the beginning and end of every term, attending after school meetings such as staff briefings, Parents and Professionals

- evenings, Pupil/Parent/Teacher meetings, as well as social events such as prize giving and school plays..
- 15. Contributing to extra curricular activities such as clubs.
- 16. Contributing to the P.E. and Games curriculum if required by the Subject Leader.
- 17. Fostering and developing areas of interest which can be shared with colleagues. This will entail attending conferences, courses and in-service training days which may fall outside school hours or in the holidays.
- 18. Developing a close liaison with parents, particularly in relationship to homework, organisation and management strategies.
- 19. Teachers with RSA/OCR Diploma/Certificate may be asked to administer reading tests.
- 20. To be part of the invigilation team for GCSEs
